




Don't let your ecommunication devices become your alternative (and defining) reality

Sometimes it feels almost impossible not to respond with anger or some form of negative dismissal...protect your family from that...


If the time or place is not right for a patient, thoughtful explanation say, "I'm sorry can I get your number and give you a call later?"




The prospects of your arguments winning the day will always be stronger if you appear to understand and respect opposing perspectives




An effective public servant acts as a bridge between political and bureaucratic worlds...get to know them and learn from them!
