1. Sources of Power
Constitution Act, 1867 – divides jurisdiction between federal and provincial governments
Community Charter and Local Government Act – delegate powers to municipalities and regional districts
Other legislation, e.g. Environmental Management Act, Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, Land Title Act, Vancouver Charter, private legislation

## 2. Authority Limitations

- Constitutional limits
   federal jurisdiction: shipping, airports, criminal law
   Charter of Rights and Freedoms
- - all local governmental actions must comply with Charter provisions
    Provincial legislation
- - bylaws subordinate to provincial legislation
- Human Rights Code



#### 3. Concurrent Jurisdiction

Health-nut council members on Orange town to take at least one multi-vitamin a day, believing this will reduce the spread of seasonal influenza. Are they going too far?



#### 3. Concurrent Jurisdiction

- Authority subject to concurrent jurisdiction with Province on health, environment, animals, buildings, soil removal approval of relevant ministry required for concurrent jurisdiction bylaws, except where regulation adopted, e.g. pesticides
- Municipal and RD bylaws no effect if inconsistent with Provincial laws

#### 4. Property Disposition

- After providing public notice of a recent sale of land to a neighbouring nudist colony, the Open Valley Regional District was inundated with letters from incensed electors.
- Can the incensed electors challenge the validity of the sale?



# 4. Property Disposition



- - notice required before disposition no general requirement to make property available to the public for acquisition
- Regional districts (s. 186 LGA)

  notice required before disposition

  must make available to the public, except disposition to not for profit corporation, public authority, land exchange, partnering agreement, owner of adjoining land

#### 5. Prohibition on Assistance

Wanting to provide more child care options in so that she could operate a day-care facility. Soon fed up with screaming children, Ms. Patience assigned her lease to Kids & Co.

#### 5. Prohibition on Assistance

- No assistance to businesses, unless under partnering agreement
  Assistance includes:
- - guaranteeing repayment of borrowing granting an exemption from a tax or fee Notice required of authorized assistance



#### 6. Elector Approval

The City of Rainmore entered into a 10 year agreement with a neighbouring First Nation for the supply of water services. Council conducted a community poll prior to signing the agreement, to ensure that it had the support of

#### 6. Elector Approval



- Alternative approval process (s. 86)

  - required for certain bylaws, e.g. capital liabilities in agreements exceeding 5 years, certain borrowing bylaws
- Elector consent (referendum) occasionally required, always optional

- Special meetings rules for calling

- Council meetings may be closed to the public to discuss
  - labour relations or employee negotiations
  - law enforcement matters
  - the acquisition or disposition of property
  - receiving legal advice
  - potential litigation

- Duties of council members (s. 115)

  consider well-being and interests of municipality and its community
  - contribute to the development and evaluation of policies and programs
  - participate in council meetings, committee meetings and meetings of other bodies where appointed carry out other duties assigned by council

ovide leadership to the council, including recommending bylaws, solutions
ovide general direction to municipal officers re implementation of policies d programs of municipality

#### 15. Reconsideration



- Reconsideration (s. 131)
  - mayor may require council to reconsider any matter whether previously adopted or rejected.
  - at the same council meeting or within 30 days
  - except where
  - previous reconsideration
     no limitation where action taken by municipalit
- Statutory power of mayor does not eliminate inherent power of council

#### **16. Bylaw Procedures**

- Councils/boards make decisions by resolution or bylaw
- Local Government Act

  bylaws where required / all other decisions may be by resolution
- deliberative and formal procedure: 3 hearings and adoption
   may include a public hearing requirement (e.g. zoning bylaws)
   may require external consent

#### 18. Interference

- Members are prohibited from interfering, hindering or obstructing an officer or employee in the performance of his/her duties
- CAO duties: operational management, policy implementation, advising
- Mayor/Chair duties: general direction to officers regarding implementation of policies

- Council/board may delegate powers, duties and functions to member, committee, officer, employee, other body

- making of a bylaw
  power/duty exercisable only by bylaw
  power/duty to give approval, consent
  power/duty to hear appeals or reconsider an action or decision
  power/duty to terminate officer

- Community Charter s. 175

  from 5 year rule elector approval required

  includes nature of the activity, work or facility, maximum term, maximum liability and any other information required by regulation

#### 21. Financial Matters

- Permissive exemptions (s. 224)
  - broader exemptions (s. 224)
    broader exemptions for charitable, philanthropic and not
