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Purposes of Engaging the Public

- Deliberate between options
- Conflict resolution
- Redistribute power







Fulfill legal requirements



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Constraints: What is off the table?

- Existing policy
- Electoral mandates and promises
- Political imperatives: funding cycles, etc.
- Available resources
- Technical constraints
- · Comfort with ambiguity

Roles in Public Engagement

- · Elected officials
- Staff
- Experts
- Stakeholders
- Public

Roles in Public Engagement

Elected officials:

- · Electoral mandate
- Deepen democratic process
- Fiduciary duty
- Accountable for decisions

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Roles in Public Engagement

Staff:

- Institutional memory
- Understand legislative context/process
- Provide expert research & analysis
- Frame options and trade-offs

Roles in Public Engagement

Experts:

- Evidence-based information
- Policy options
- Long-term thinking
- Cross-pollinate innovations and lessons learned
- 3rd party neutrality

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Roles in Public Engagement

Stakeholder Groups:

- Reflect perspectives and (special) interests
- Topic expertise
- Network mobilization
- Proxy for others (sometimes)
- Anchored by member views

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Roles in Public Engagement

Citizens:

- On-the-ground experience (feedback loop)
- Judge options relative to values (unique value add)
- Represent own interests (democratic process)
- Public license (come election time)

Commitment to the Public

- Why should they bother to invest their time?
- How do they know decision isn't already made?
- What question do you need the answer to?
- Everything you do or don't do sends a message.
