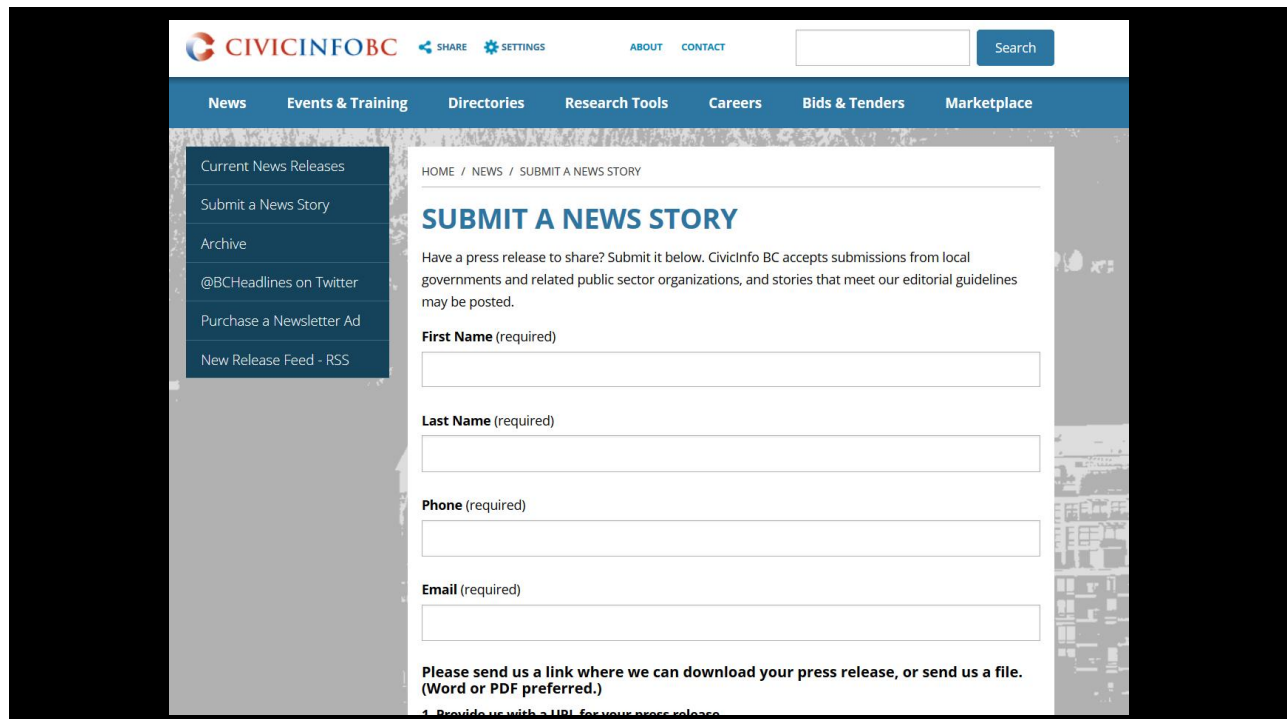
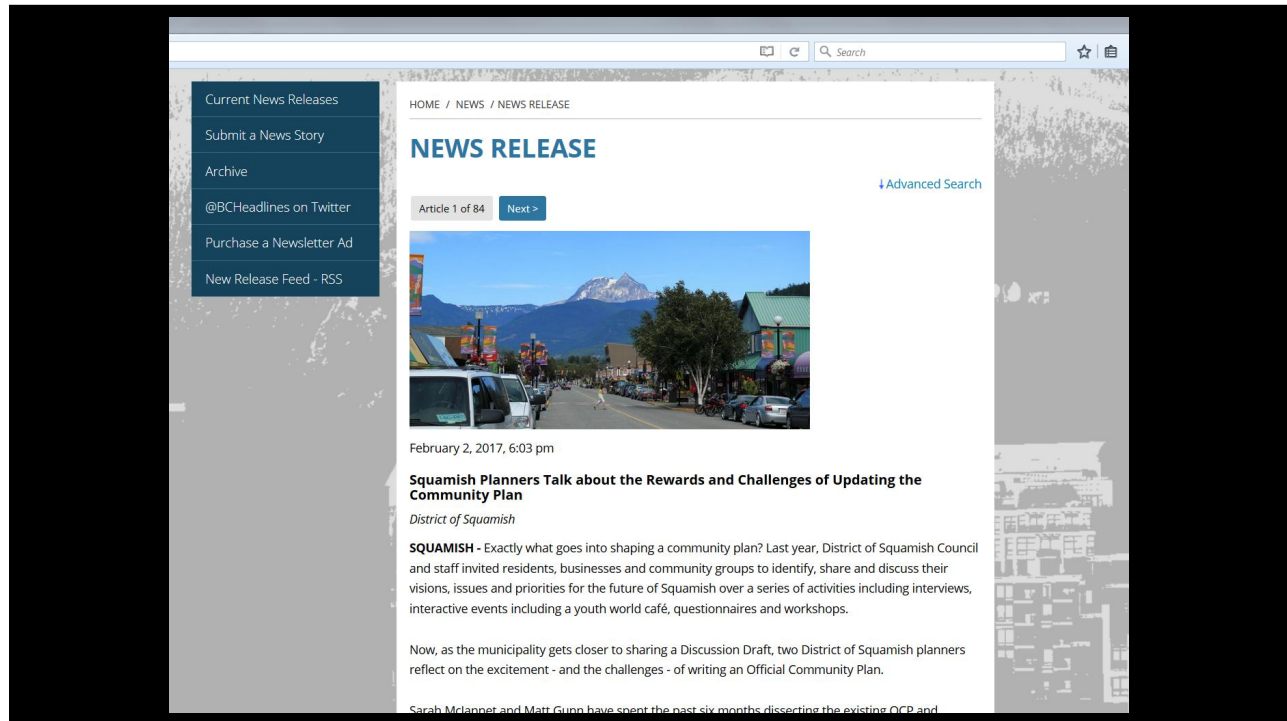




# **TIP #1: NEWS SERVICES**

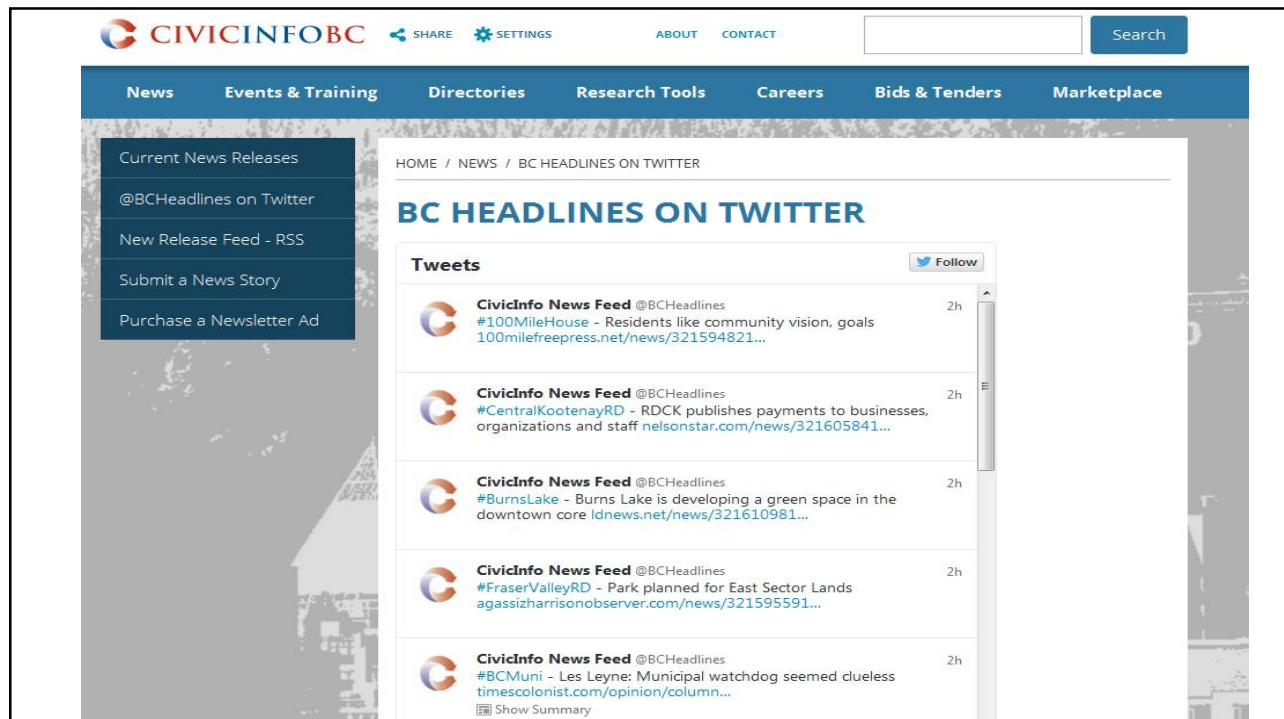
## **NEWS SERVICES**

- CivicInfo BC cross-posts municipal press releases, as well as relevant ones from associations, agencies, and other levels of government.
- Stories are rotated on our home page; posted for about a month under “News” tab; then archived.



## NEWS SERVICES

- Local government news headlines posted daily on Twitter: @BCHeadlines
- Stories from municipalities, regional districts, and First Nations. Basically unfiltered.
- We don't post public notices, and we don't post routine police and fire business.

## TIP #2: EVENTS & TRAINING





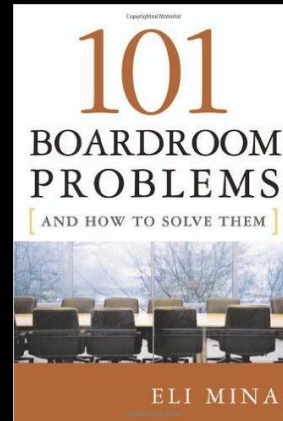

## EVENTS & TRAINING

- Listing of local government conferences, workshops, seminars, and courses.
- Most are staff oriented, but there's lots for elected officials as well, e.g, LGLA events; UBCM conferences and workshops; Area Association conventions, and CivX events.

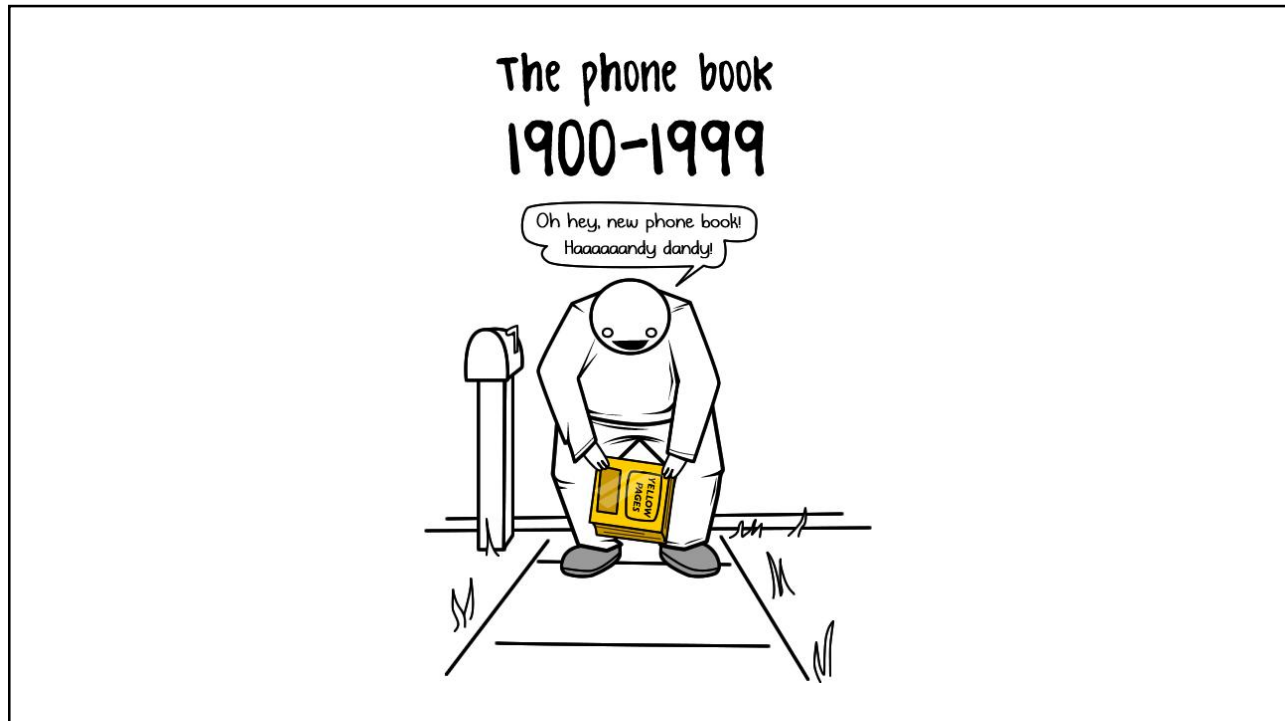
## EVENTS & TRAINING

- Small online store with a handful of books and manuals. (Likely to grow.)
- Online registrations for event organizers.



## TIP #3: DIRECTORIES





## DIRECTORIES

- CivicInfo BC's directories contain complete contact information for BC local governments, local government staff, and elected officials.
- CivicInfo BC also provides a basic directory of First Nation communities, and (courtesy of the Province) a listing of Improvement Districts.

## DIRECTORIES

- Lists are constantly being updated.
- Local governments may update own records; CivicInfo BC staff also make updates in consultation with other key agencies.
- We have approximately 5,000 – 6,000 active records at any time.

## DIRECTORIES

- Little known, very useful tool: all local governments have access to a password-protected contact list generator.
- Password usually held by the Municipal Clerk.
- Instantly generate mailing or email lists (BCC!); apply filters for regions, professional categories, elected official type, etc.

### SURVEYS

- CivicInfo BC conducts annual surveys in partnership with the Union of BC Municipalities and Local Government Management Association of BC.
- The Province, BC Transit, and others have also been involved with specific surveys.
- Surveys conducted in February and October.



## SURVEYS



- February: salary surveys, elected official remuneration.
- October: mostly fees and charges.

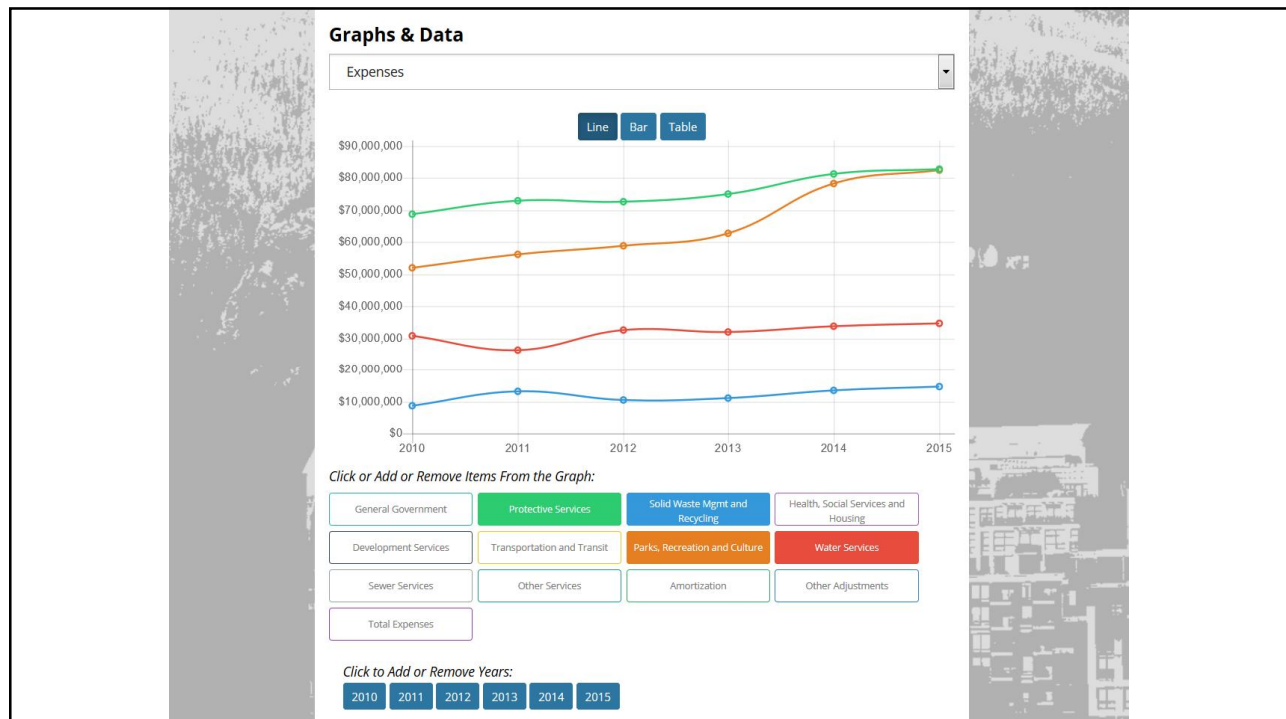

## TIP #6: ELECTION INFORMATION

### ELECTION INFORMATION



- CivicInfo BC has been tracking BC local election results since 2002.
- Full lists of candidates, and voter turnout calculations, since 2008.

## ELECTION INFORMATION

### 2014

- 427 candidates for mayor.
- 1,789 for councillor.
- 273 for electoral area director
- 748 for school trustee
- 38 for Islands Trust councillor
- 40 for park boards
- 9 for advisory & water councillors

## ELECTION INFORMATION

### 2014 Turnout

- Municipal: 33.3%
- Regional District Electoral Areas: 22.8%





## ELECTION INFORMATION

How can you be of assistance?

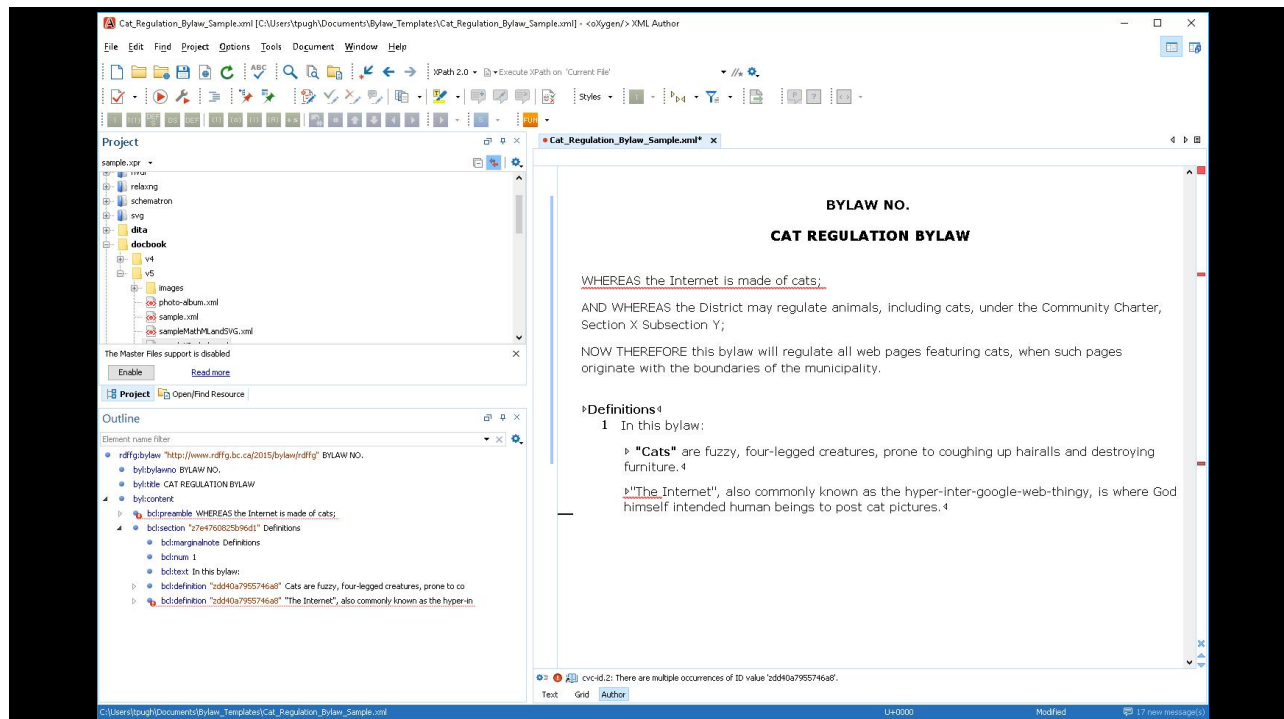
- Consider ways to increase voter turnout. (e.g., Promote things like “Student Vote”.)
- Share your information openly and early.
- Encourage your Chief Election Officers to work with us, sharing information quickly.

## TIP #7: DOCUMENT SHARING



## DOCUMENT SHARING

- We maintain a Google custom search that crawls all local government websites in the province.
- We also have a locally-hosted archive of shared documents.
- Enhancements underway. (Archive; special collections of curated materials.)

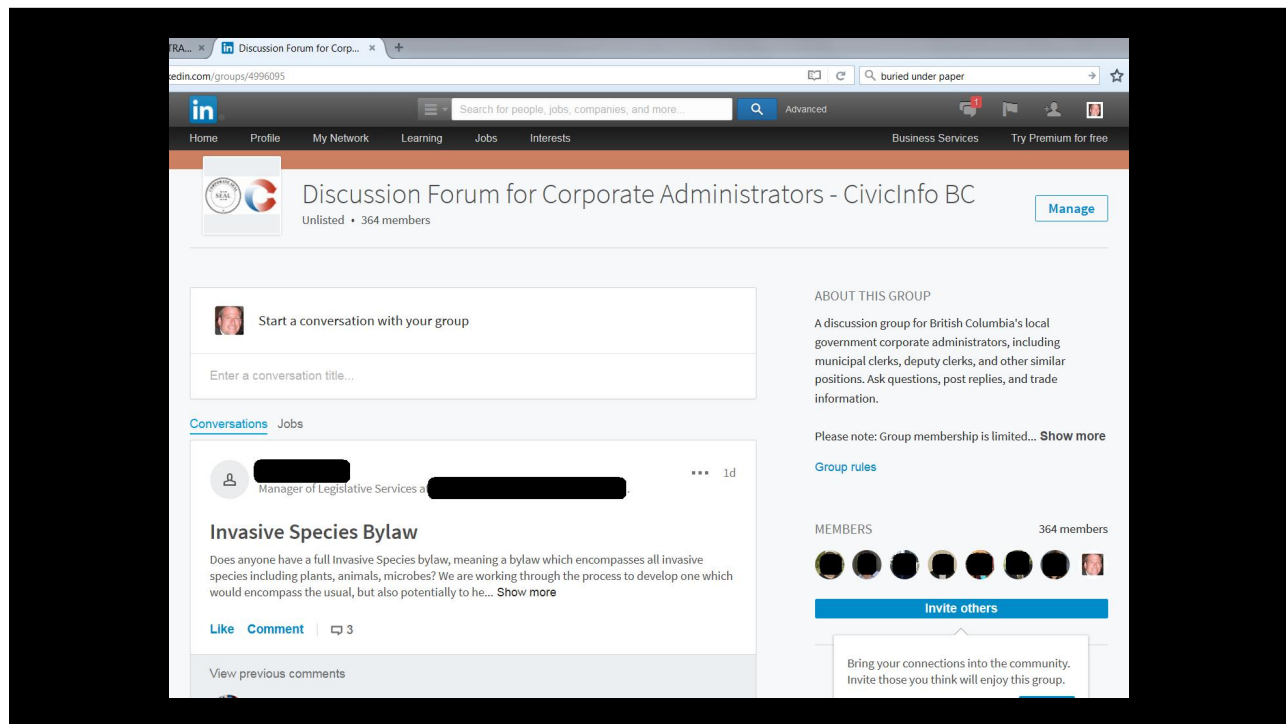


## TIP #8: DISCUSSION FORUMS

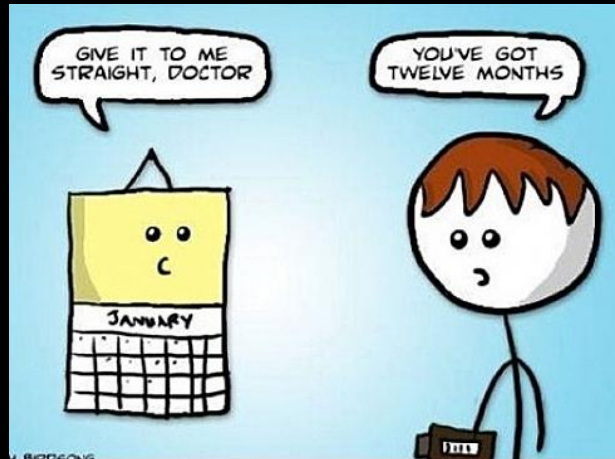


## GRANTS DATABASE

- Conditional grant opportunities (not automatic) available to local governments.
- Contains grant descriptions, deadlines, searchable by subject area, links to application forms whenever possible.

## TIP #10: LEGISLATIVE CALENDAR



### LEGISLATIVE CALENDAR

- Contains all key dates set by provincial statutes and regulations, and other important deadlines.
- Legal review conducted annually.
- Outlook calendar download also available.



## TIP #11: JOB POSTINGS

## JOB POSTINGS

- CivicInfo BC operates Canada's largest local government job boards.
- CivicInfo BC's regional job board, with LGMA BC, mostly has a BC-based professional audience.
- CivicJobs.ca has a growing national and public audience.

## JOB POSTINGS

- 2,600 jobs posted in 2008 – BC Only.
- 1,600 in 2009
- 2,000 in 2010
- 2,400 in 2011
- 2,900 in 2012 & 2013
- 3,150 in 2014.
- 3,500 in 2015.
- 4,350 in 2016.



## JOB POSTINGS

- We work hard to ensure jobs reach both local government offices *and* members of the general public.
- Weekly e-mail bulletins have over 11,000 subscribers.
- Postings are also distributed through social media, and through key aggregators like WorkBC, Indeed.ca, Wowjobs.ca, and (soon) Government of Canada JobBank.
