#### 2018/19 LOCAL GOVERNMENT LEADERSHIP ACADEMY ANNUAL REPORT

#### Background:

Formed collaboratively in 2005 by UBCM, MFA, LGMA, BCA, MIA, local governments of BC and the Province of BC, the LGLA provides comprehensive, timely and dedicated leadership development opportunities throughout each electoral term in the interests of improving governance at the local level. An original endowment from each of the founding organizations, plus subsequent contributions, has enabled the LGLA to provide quality programming since its establishment.

LGLA's main offerings are the Elected Officials Seminars in the winter immediately following local government elections and a province-wide annual Leadership Forum in between election years. In addition, we have held an annual Chief Executive Officer (Mayors/Chairs/Chiefs) Forum and periodic webinars with educational partners such as LGMA, the SFU Centre for Dialogue, and the then Ministry of Jobs, Tourism & Skills Training.

We have also succeeded in establishing a presence at both the UBCM Convention and often at the spring Area Association conferences.

#### Overview of the Main Events

LGLA's flagship Elected Officials Seminar Series for newly elected and returning elected officials was held during January and February 2019. A total of seven events were held in five locations around the province - as noted above. Turnout was excellent at all sessions and participants rated the events highly. Featured speakers included Keynote Speaker Greg Moore, former Mayor of Port Coquitlam; Tracey Lorenson of Civic Excellence; Eli Mina, Professional Registered Parliamentarian; Frank Leonard, local government consultant and former Mayor of Saanich; Todd Pugh of the CivicInfo Society; Chris Olsen of Peak Communications; a host of experts on topics such as local government planning, sustainability, and Indigenous relations; and representatives of LGLA partner organizations supporting the local government sector.

#### Other Events of Note

UBCM welcomed Gabi Vindisch, incoming LGLA Executive Coordinator, to the 2019 Convention. Gabi was onsite to coordinate presentation of the 2019 LGLA Certificates in Local Government Leadership at the Tuesday Forums. She was also able to spend some time at the UBCM booth on day one, at the Convention Tradeshow, and to take some time to meet with members of the LGLA Board and supporting organizations.

#### 2018 AREA ASSOCIATION CONFERENCES

Unfortunately, due to staff turnover and the significant work needed for organizing and hosting the 2019 Elected Officials Seminars, LGLA was not able to participate in the conferences in 2018/19.

#### **WEBINARS**

No webinars were held in 2018/19. Staff and Board efforts were devoted exclusively to organizing and hosting the 2019 Elected Officials Seminars.

#### STRATEGIC ACTIVITIES

In addition to the learning events noted above, the LGLA has been involved in the following strategic activities over the past year.

#### **Partnerships**

In Fall 2019, LGLA participated in meetings with two delegates from Jordan, as part of LGMA's work on the Federation of Canadian Municipalities' Jordan Municipal Support Project through which Jordan's Ministry of Municipal Affairs is establishing the country's first Municipal Training Institute. Hearing first hand how the partners in the BC local government system operate collaboratively to help build its capacity, including by offering training of local government elected officials through LGLA, was an important part of the delegates' visit to B.C.

Building on the already strong relationship between the LGLA and UBCM, significant work also went into completion of an agreement between UBCM and LGLA for UBCM to provide program support services to LGLA, setting the stage for LGLA to stabilize its staff support.
